Born and raised 20 miles from Hartismere in Swardeston. During World War One she treated German patients as well as British.

Received the prize known as the Maidstone medal having worked as a nurse with hundreds of patients during a deadly outbreak of Typhus of 1897. She was arrested and executed by firing squad; her final words were, 'Patriotism is not enough. I must have no hatred or bitterness towards anyone.'

Within the church of England, Edith Cavell is celebrated as a Saint. A statue in her honour has been placed in Trafalgar Square, London as her national monument.
